### **Use of personal electronic devices**

Who doesn't have their phone with them at all times? Can't wait for the wheels to touch down to start using your mobile? We understand. But there are rules for this, rules established by the FAA.

The FAA has determined that certain electronic devices could cause minor interference with aircraft navigational instruments. Therefore, restrictions on the use of personal electronic devices are necessary while on board Lync Air aircraft.

Most consumer portable electronic devices intended for personal use are permitted in checked or carry-on baggage, including cell phones, electronic games, tablets, laptops, and cameras. Batteries for these devices typically do not exceed the limitations for carriage.

Although PEDs are permitted in customer's baggage, use of these devices is restricted, as governed by the FAA. This includes, but is not limited to, cell phones, electronic games, tablets, laptops, cameras, and portable music devices. Use of electronic devices are at the sole discretion of the pilot in command. Lync Air flies to some pretty cool places, feel free to take all the pictures you want!

#### **Approved PEDs for use onboard at all times, with no restrictions include:**

- Hearing aids
- Pacemakers and other approved electronic medical devices
- Portable voice recorders (which really means your smartphone in airplane mode)
- Electronic/digital watches
- Electric shavers
- One-way pagers (capable of receiving signals only)

#### **Prohibited PEDs, **not approved** for use at ANY time onboard include:**

- AM/FM transmitters and receivers (including televisions and radios)
- Bluetooth accessories (e.g., wireless mice, keyboards, headphones)
- Electronic, simulated smoking (vaping) materials (e.g., cigarettes, pipes, cigars)
- Personal air purifiers
- Remote control devices or toys

- Two-way communication devices (unless otherwise permitted pursuant to this section)
- Portable oxygen concentrators (POCs)
